1. Announcement

The South of Scotland Ltd will promote the Grierson & Graham Targa Rally on Sunday 11th May 2014 under a Clubman Targa Road Rally Permit .

The event will Start at Drumlanrig Castle (Thornhill) DG3 4AQ and Finish at the Kames Motorsport Complex (Muirkirk) KA18 3QQ

2. Jurisdiction

The event will be held under the general rules of the Motor Sports Association (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), and these Supplementary Regulations, together with any other written instructions that the organising clubs may issue for the event.

4. Crew eligibility

4.1The event is open to all fully elected members of the South of Scotland Car Club Ltd.4.2 All competitors must produce a valid Club membership card, which will be inspected at signing on. Memberships can be applied for on entering.

4.3 Drivers must hold a full valid Road Traffic Act driving licence for a car. Navigators must have attained the age of 12 years.

We are electing to run this event as closed-to-club

5. Programme – Subject to alteration in the bulletins and final instructions:

5.1 Location

All tests will be on private property, with a mixture of Concrete, Tarmac, Gravel, and maybe a little grass and mud.

Please note - Petrol is available on route

6. Access

Access to the Start venue is available from 07:45 am onwards.

7.Noise Check

Noise check will open at 08.00am. Vehicles failing the noise check will not be allowed to start.

8.Scrutineering

Follow the arrows on arrival at the venue to the car parking area. Please park as directed and report to signing-on. Noise check, Scrutineering and signing on will be within or adjacent to the car parking area Drumlanrig Castle Thornhill DG3 4AQ. Any competitor not signed on by 9.30 am will not be allowed to start.

 $\Box \Box A$ valid MOT certificate for use on the public highway must be presented.

□ □ Cars must have a valid Road Fund Licence.

 \Box \Box All tyres must be road legal.

□ It is the responsibility of Drivers to prove to the Police, if required, that non E marked tyres are fit for purpose.

□ □ A Warning Triangle MUST be carried.

□ □ A small environmental spill kit must be carried in the vehicle.

9. Documentation

Final instructions, venue map and any other documentation relevant to the final instructions will be sent by email on or before Wednesday, 7th May 2014 competition licences are not required, but means all competitors must produce a club card at signing on.

On the day of the event, following Scrutineering and signing on, competitors will be supplied with all necessary instructions, diagrams, road book and time cards to allow them to complete the rally within the overall event timetable.

10. Briefing

There will be a compulsory crew briefing at 09:30 adjacent to the signing on area.

11.Route Information

The first car will leave the start at 10.00a.m and thereafter at one-minute intervals. The event will follow a route of around 50 miles through Upper Nithsdale and South Ayrshire No maps will be required. The competitive part of the event will consist of up to 12 timed tests on private land.

Test Definition

Diagrams will define all of the tests with the route clearly marked.

Tests should be completed in accordance with the time schedule.

12. Notices

Before, during and after the event, official notices will be displayed on the official notice board in the Start / Signing On area at.Drumlanrig Castle & Kames Motorsport Complex Competitors may have to sign for notices on the official notice board.

13. Toilets

Toilet facilities will be available at start & finish venues

14. Refreshments

Local catering will be engaged for the event. Hot drinks and food will be on sale from 8am onwards within the Drumlanrig courtyard. Marshals will be provided with a voucher for one hot drink and snack free of charge, as some recognition of their contribution as indeed without them the event would not run.

15.Prohibited Equipment

Video equipment may not be used in competing cars.

Competitors may not wear crash helmets of any type.

The use of intercoms for competitors other than those with medical dispensation is not allowed. No pace notes made separately from the test diagrams provided are permitted.

The penalty for breaching these restrictions is exclusion from this event

17. Classes & Eligibility

Cars must comply with R18 (be modern road rally legal), so engines can have a maximum of 4 cylinders.

New 2014 MSA rule R18.2.5 allows forced-induction for petrol and diesel engines under 1500cc. The event is open to any vehicle that complies with Section R.18 of

the MSA Technical Regulations. But please note the following:

Targa Permit - R18 to 18.6.6 Please read 18.6.6 first. Note, engines may only have a maximum of 4 Cylinders and a maximum of Two Chokes. Fuel Injection is only permitted if originally fitted as standard

Classes

Competitors may enter as Novices, Experts or Masters.

There will be the following classes:

MA Masters with engine capacity 1400cc or less plus up to 1500cc Diesel MB Masters with engine capacity over 1400cc

EA Experts with engine capacity 1400cc or less plus up to 1500cc Diesel

EB Experts with engine capacity over 1400cc

NA Novices with engine capacity 1400cc or less plus up to 1500cc Diesel

NB Novices with engine capacity over 1400cc

<u>Masters</u>: Driver has *won their class* on any Rally or Gymkhanas with Special Tests in the last 5 years.

Experts: Driver has *previously competed on 5 or more* Rallies or Gymkhanas with Special Tests. **Novices:** Driver has *previously competed on less than 5* Rallies or Gymkhanas with Special Tests. Tests.

Endurance and Historic Road Rallies count towards this. Class wins as a Novice on this event and future Targa Rallies do not count towards becoming a Master.

Competitors can only enter one class. The Organisers reserve the right to alter classes if they think that is appropriate e.g. less than 2 entries are received for a class.

18.Entries

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and entry form.

The entry list closes on Sunday 4th May 2014

All entries must be made on the official entry form and be accompanied by the appropriate fee.

Withdrawn entries notified by 04/04/14 will receive a full refund; those withdrawn after this date will be refunded in full or part at the organisers' discretion.

The entry fee is £65 per car and crew of two members. Non-members are required to join the Organising Club . Application Forms will be available with Entry Form

The entry fee includes B-B-Q snack at lunch halt & two snack meals at the Finish.

19.Final Instructions

Final instructions will confirm starting times etc and will only be sent by e-mail to the e-mail addresses specified on the entry form. It is our intention to keep this event relatively paperless and so where possible all documentation will be electronic.

Rally Plates and numbers that will be supplied by the organisers will identify cars.

They must be affixed as detailed in the Final Instructions.

The Maximum number of entries is 40. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt.

Teams of three competing crews may compete for a team award.

Team entries must be submitted no later than 4th May 2014 (£5 per team).

20. Awards

First Overall Driver and Navigator (first overall crew cannot also win a class award).

First in Class Driver and Navigator

Second in Class Driver and Navigator (subject to 4 entries)

Third in Class Driver and Navigator (subject to 6 entries)

Team Award

First Lady Award (Driver or Navigator)

In the event of a tie, R 15.2.2 will apply

21. Results

Provisional results will be published during the day and finalised prior to the awards presentations. Protests will be dealt with in accordance with C.5. Final results will be published on the South of Scotland website: www.soscc.co.uk

22. Penalties

Competitors will start at one-minute intervals, unless otherwise instructed by an official. Penalties will be as R13 – Appendix 1 Chart 13 except as modified below. Penalties on Special Tests:

a) Time to complete the test. Test Minimum, which will be the stated Bogey time;

b) Striking a cone during a test 10 seconds;

c) Failing to stop astride a stop line 10 seconds;

d) Ignoring a stop astride line Test Maximum;

e) Jump Start 10 seconds;

f) Not completing a test by the correct route other than in (h or i) Test Maximum;

g) Starting but not completing a test. Test Maximum;

h) Not attempting a test. Test Maximum;

i) The wrong test penalty will be applied as follows; If you make a mistake on a test and pass the wrong side of a cone, or the wrong way round a cone, you can retrace your steps and this will not be counted as a wrong test. Once you have passed two consecutive cones incorrectly you will automatically incur the penalty for not performing a test correctly. Test Maximum Calculation

The Test Maximum is calculated as follows;

At a given Test if all the cars in the Class have incurred a Test Maximum penalty then the Test Maximum = Lowest Penalty Overall + 60 seconds, otherwise the Test Maximum = Lowest Penalty in that Class + 45 seconds.

Scheduled Time Sections:

a) Not reporting at a Main Time Control Exclusion

j) No penalties will be applied for late arrival other than maximum lateness.

Timing

23. Data Protection Act

Prospective entrants and competitors are advised that information supplied on the entry form will be held on a computer and used for the administration of the event. Details may be passed to other event organisers for the purpose of the circulation of event regulations. If you do not wish your details to be circulated please indicate this on the entry form.

24. Mobile Phones

Mobile phones may be carried for the purpose of emergency calls only.

Judges of Fact

All Officials, Driving Standards Observers and any other persons specifically named as such in these S.R.s, in Final Instructions, or on the official Notice Board at the start, or signed on as marshals, are deemed to be Judges of Fact in respect of their duties as specified in such Instructions or Notices, and in respect of compliance with the relevant parts of R8, G10 & G11.

Driving Standards Observers (DSO) may be appointed by the Clerk of the Course. DSOs may not necessarily be identified as such, and competitors will not be required to stop by a DSO, unless he or she is also acting in another capacity, e.g. a Control of some kind.

Quiet Zones will be defined and listed in Final Instructions. Competitors will be expected to drive with care in these zonesand in the highest practicable gear. A

more detailed interpretation will be given in Final Instructions.

25.Competitors under the age of 18

Any Competitor under the age of 18 must:

a) Have their entry form countersigned by a parent or guardian.

b) Have a Parent or Guardian complete the Parental Consent Form attached with these SR's AND

c) Have one of their parents at "signing on" to countersign the signing-on sheet, or alternatively have someone with them who is authorised in writing by their parent or guardian to sign on their behalf.

PLEASE NOTE. If there is no Parental or Guardian consent in accordance with the above, then those under 18 years of age cannot be permitted to take part in the event.

26.Insurance

All vehicles must be insured for use on the public highway. The insurer's name must be stated on the Entry Form, unless using the REIS Road Section Insurance.

It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure appropriate insurances are in place.

The Club has applied to REIS for a Blanket Cover Note under their scheme (Cover Note number - To be Advised)

This scheme provides competitors with the Third Party cover necessary to meet RTA requirements on the road sections of the event.

The blanket cover note will be displayed on the official event Notice Board. The fee for this service is £20 but if a driver is unable to sign compliance with the following (at signing-on) special terms may need to be negotiated with REIS on an individual basis (see the box below). Please advise any loading terms that may apply.

Insurance Provider

Road Section Insurance is provided by Chaucer Insurance.

Acceptance Limits – Competitor Cover

Automatic acceptance will be given to all competitors meeting the following criteria;

 $\Box \Box Age 19$ years or over

□ Has held a full licence for a minimum of 6 Months

 \square \square Has no more than 6 points on their licence

 \Box Has no more than 1 fault claim in the last three years.

□ Anyone aged less than 19 years old will also be accepted at the same price should their co-driver be a more senior member of the family or over 25

Material Facts are those likely to influence the acceptance or assessment of your risk. Failure to disclose Material Facts may lead to the insurer declaring the resultant cover to be null and void. If you are in any doubt about facts that may be considered to be material, these should be disclosed for your own protection.

It should be noted that the scheme imposes an excess of £250, for which the relevant competitor against whom a successful claim is made may be liable.
